“Because of UW-Extension” Social Media Campaign

*A message from Rick Klemme,
UW-Extension Cooperative Extension Dean and Director:*

Gov. Scott Walker’s 2015-2017 proposed Wisconsin budget includes a \$150 million base cut to the University of Wisconsin System. This severe and abrupt cut represents an approximate 13% reduction to the State of Wisconsin’s General Purpose Revenue (GPR) support for the UW System. Because UW-Extension is part of the UW System, this cut will negatively impact the quality and variety of UW-Extension programs available around the state. In addition, Cooperative Extension faces targeted cuts that would eliminate 13.45 positions in addition to the nearly \$3 million from our budget resulting from the cuts to UW System. UW-Extension resources benefit Wisconsin communities, businesses, farms, families and people. You can help us communicate the value and importance of UW-Extension by sharing exactly how you benefit from our educational programs through a social media campaign entitled, “Because of UW-Extension.”

Why Social Media?

Emails and telephone calls are very important methods for communicating with lawmakers. And, recent trends suggest comments and conversations over social media are increasingly influential to legislators and their staff. For example, Chris Nehls writes on the Connectivity blog, “In a poll of House and Senate offices by the Congressional Management Foundation, three quarters of senior staff said that between one and 30 comments on social media platforms like Facebook and Twitter were enough to grab their attention on an issue. Thirty-five percent said that fewer than 10 comments were enough.” Nehls also indicates that Facebook is still king, and Twitter is the crown prince.

Deadline for Project Enrollments

Do you have changes to your chosen project areas? You can log on to your account at wi.4HOnline.com and make changes in your project areas until April 1. After April 1, changes must go through the UW-Extension office. In addition, per Barron County 4-H Association policy, any youth enrolling or re-enrolling in 4-H after April 1 will not be eligible to enter in the Barron County Fair this year through 4-H. Any youth enrolling or re-enrolling in 4-H after April 1 will be able to take part in all other 4-H activities.

4-H International Host Opportunities

Hosts are needed for 4-H summer and Academic Year international students. Share your American culture and life by providing a welcoming home to a new friend from another country! In the summer of 2015, more than 70 youth from Argentina, Japan, South Korea, Mexico, and Norway will spend a month living with Wisconsin host families and learning about American culture. If you are between 10-18 years old and want to take part in a month that will stay with you for a lifetime, apply now. Chaperone hosts are also needed for two week periods during these time frames. Applications are still being accepted until all youth are assigned. Hosting requirements include having a genuine interest, being flexible and willing to spend time with the student, and having an extra bed available (not necessarily an extra room). Previous hosting experience is not required. All host adults must be complete Wisconsin 4-H Youth Protection.

Make Your Own Sidewalk Chalk!



Warmer weather is on the way and that means it's time to get outside! Here's a fun activity that everyone in the family can take part in...make sidewalk chalk!

Materials:

- 2 cups water
- 2 cups Plaster of Paris
- 2 Tablespoons Tempera Paint (wet or dry)
- A bucket to mix in
- A big spoon or stick to mix with
- Toilet paper tubes with duct tape over one end
- Cookie sheet lined with aluminum foil or waxed paper

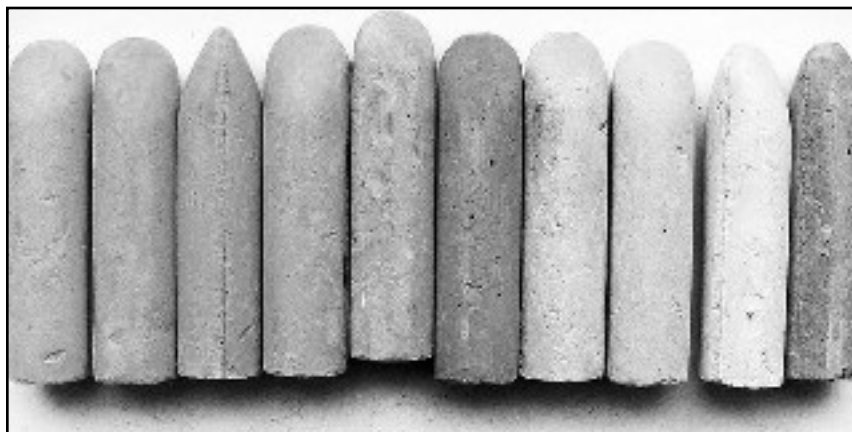


Procedure:

1. Combine and stir together all ingredients, and let stand for a few minutes.
2. Place prepared toilet paper tubes on cookie sheet lined with aluminum foil or waxed paper.
3. Pour mixture into holders, let stand until semi-firm.
4. Remove holders and let dry completely. Your chalk should be ready to use in about 1 1/2 hours.
6. Now use your sidewalk chalk to draw a picture outside!

Cat Project Reminders

Members enrolled in the cat project should remember that they must own their cat or kitten for at least four months prior to the fair. Participants may not show someone else's cat or borrow or use a cat from the Humane Society unless you adopt it four months before the fair. This means you have taken care of it at your home for four months before the fair. All cats must be vaccinated for rabies and Panleukopenia (distemper). Kittens under six months are not required to have the rabies vaccination. Visit www.barroncountyfair.com and click on the fairbook link to find all cat show requirements.

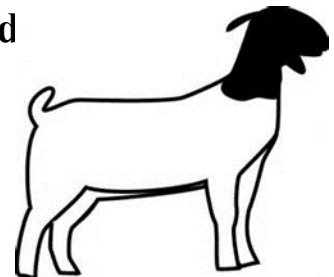

AmeriCorps VISTA Position Available with UW-Extension

UW-Extension Barron County has an opening for a one-year, full-time volunteer through the AmeriCorps VISTA program. The Community Outreach Coordinator will work with UW-Extension and its partners to expand and create community programs, promote positive youth development, and enhance volunteer activities.
