
Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development is part of the University of Wisconsin-Extension, and 4-H programs are delivered in partnership with the United States Department of Agriculture and federal, state and local governments. 4-H has its roots in youth corn and agriculture clubs, which helped researchers at the University of Wisconsin-Extension share the latest agriculture developments with farmers by teaching their children. While agriculture is still one important focus, 4-H has expanded a lot in the past 100 years!

In Wisconsin, more than 35,000 youth are enrolled as 4-H club members. Nearly 50,000 more young people are involved in 4-H through in-school and after-school clubs, day camps, mentoring programs and other opportunities. All Wisconsin 4-H programs are supported by the hard work of more than 20,000 youth and adult volunteers. Wisconsin 4-H programs continue to emphasize lifelong learning and a strong connection with the University of Wisconsin, and programs are available for all interests including science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), agriculture and animal science, arts and communications, leadership, healthy living, international exchange and more.

Training Center Location: National Guard Armory, 307 East Barker Street, Rice Lake. Training meetings will be held on Monday and Thursday nights with each meeting night divided into two sessions as follows:

Early Session – 5:30 – 7:00 p.m., Late Session – 7:00 – 8:30 p.m.

Participants may eventually select an early/late/Monday/Thursday time segment that best fits their schedule.

(The above training session scheme is subject to change depending upon the number or project participants.) The project fee should be paid at the first session.

Starting Dates: Monday, January 20 and Thursday, January 23.

Training sessions will continue through nine consecutive weeks with the final training sessions to be held on Monday, March 17 and Thursday, March 20. The fair shoot will be held March 24 and March 27.

WI 4-H Foundation Scholarships

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will be offering more than \$9,000 in scholarships to outstanding students pursuing undergraduate degrees in 2014.

The 2014 scholarships will be given in the areas of agriculture, leadership, community service, animal sciences and natural resources.

To be eligible, students must have been a 4-H member for at least one year; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; be enrolled or planning to enroll in a university, college or technical school during the 2013-2014 academic school year; and meet any other eligibility requirements specific to the individual scholarship.



State Fair Dairy Promotion Board Scholarship

The Wisconsin State Fair Dairy Promotion Board will award three \$1,000 scholarships, for use during the second semester of the 2014-15 school year, to third or fourth-year college students pursuing dairy-related or food science degrees at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities. Two additional \$1,000 scholarships will be made available to high school seniors planning to pursue a dairy-related or food science degree at one of Wisconsin's four-year universities or students studying in a two-year, technical school program related to dairy or food science. Applicants will be evaluated on involvement and leadership in ag-related activities, scholastic achievement, and career objectives. Finalists will be interviewed in mid-April, with the recipients to be recognized at the 2014 Wisconsin State Fair.

Wisconsin State Fair Market Steer Exhibitors

Exhibitors wishing to exhibit junior market steers at the 2014 Wisconsin State Fair (July 31 to August 10) will need to self-identify their steers with an official RFID identification tag and submit a DNA hair sample between January 1 and February 10. Animal identification request forms are available at www.wistatefair.com. Request forms must be sent or delivered to Wisconsin State Fair with proper fees. Upon processing identification requests, Wisconsin State Fair will send RFID (Allflex) identification tag(s), identification documentation and DNA sample submission envelopes to each exhibitor. The exhibitor must self-identify his/her animals by placing the official WSF RFID tag in the animal's ear, collecting a DNA sample (hair) and completing the animal identification documentation form. DNA samples with the identification documentation must be returned to Wisconsin State Fair no later than 4:30 pm on February 10.

Steers must be identified in the exhibitor's name or in immediate family member names. If steers are identified in the immediate family name only one form needs to be submitted along with correct fees, however, all siblings' names MUST appear on the top of the form. Cousins are not considered immediate family and may not co-identify the same steer. There is no limit to the number of market steers which may be identified by an exhibitor; however, exhibitors are limited to entering and bringing no more than two market steers to the Fair.

The cost for each animal to be identified is \$15 (includes WSF ear tag and DNA envelope). Allflex ear taggers (\$20) and a needle nose pliers to extract hair DNA (\$5) may also be purchased from Wisconsin State Fair if needed.

Performance Division Identification Site:

Exhibitors wishing to enter the performance division must take their steers to one of the identification sites to get weighed. Performance steers must have been identified by February 10 with a WSF RFID ear tag and have submitted a DNA sample. The nearest identification site is March 8 Equity Livestock Altoona 9 to 10 am.
