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### Welcoming New Families To 4-H

When new families contact the UW-Extension Office about joining 4-H, I encourage them to call or visit one or more clubs in the county and join the one that has the best “fit” for their 4-H interests. I often wonder what kind of experiences the new family has when they visit a club meeting. Will they have a positive impression? With many new families joining each year, we all need to look at how welcoming we are as an organization. At your next club meeting, evaluate whether or not your club has a welcoming environment.

Think about the following:

- What was your experience like when your family joined 4-H?
- What is it like for a new member and his/her family when joining your club?
- Are new members introduced at the first club meeting they attend?
- Do some of your members make it a point to talk with the member and their family after the club meeting?
- Does anyone follow up after the first meeting by contacting the new family and answer any questions they may have before the next meeting?

Here are some suggestions to ensure that your club has a welcoming environment:

- Ask for experienced families to become “ambassadors” for your club. Their role would be to greet new families, make them feel welcome, and answer questions throughout the year.
- Have name tags available for the first few meetings each year to help new families get to know your club.
- Start a mentor program for new members and their families. A seasoned 4-H family could volunteer to mentor a new family during their first year in 4-H. Understanding projects, 4-H club activities, county activities, and the county fair can be a daunting task in the first year.

Spend some time at your next meeting discussing how your club can become more welcoming to new members. Remember, everyone was a new member at one time!

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## New Volunteer Orientation

Do you want to become a 4-H Adult Volunteer? Adults who regularly work with youth at the club level or county level should enroll in 4-H and participate in the 4-H youth protection process. Committee members who vote on decisions that affect 4-H programming are required to be trained volunteers.

To become an adult volunteer, attend a one-time training where you will enroll using 4HOnline, learn about 4-H programming and how to protect youth. The youth protection process includes a background check on all new volunteers, which is then repeated every four years. As a volunteer, you will re-enroll each year and adhere to the volunteer behavior agreement set forth by the State 4-H program.

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# Can You Hear Me Now?



Make your own tin can smartphone! No, the phone can't send text messages, or access the internet, or download apps...the smart part comes from YOU!

### *Materials Needed:*

- Empty tin cans (2 per telephone line, vegetable or fruit cans work well)
- Cotton or Nylon String (10-20 feet per telephone line)
- Candle Wax (if using cotton string)
- Metal Washers (1 per tin can)
- Nail
- Hammer
- Duct Tape or Wide Masking Tape

### *Instructions:*

1. Remove one end of each can. Cover edges with duct tape or wide masking tape so you don't cut yourself on sharp edges. If you are using cotton string, coat it with candle wax.
2. Have an adult help you use the hammer and nail to drive a hole into the center of the end of the can.
3. Thread the string through the end of the can. Wrap the end of the string around the washer and tie several knots in it. The washer will keep the string from pulling out when the phone is in use.
4. Give one can to a partner and stand far enough away to make the string pull straight and tight. Speak into your can while your partner holds his or her can up to their ear.
5. Say, "Hello, can you hear me?" Take turns talking and listening!

### *Investigate!*

What happens if you:

- Let the string go loose?
- Whisper into the can?
- Make a phone with a string longer than 20 feet?
- Use paper cups rather than tin cans?
- Remove the washer and make big knots to hold the string inside the can?
- Make a "three-way call"? (Hint: Tie another string and can to the middle of the first string.)

What other things can you think of to try? What is the best way to make a tin can phone work?



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## Animal Sciences

### Dairy Quiz Bowl

Do you like dairy cows? Barron County teams are now forming for the 2015 4-H Dairy Quiz Bowl! The 4-H State Dairy Quiz Bowl will be Saturday, February 7, in Portage, WI. During the competition, contestants will answer a variety of questions about dairy cattle. Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator. Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner.

There will be three divisions; Junior, Senior and Mixed which may be composed of both Junior and Senior aged participants. Junior participants must be age 9-13 on January 1, 2015 and Senior participants must be age 14-18 on January 1, 2015.

Barron County will schedule several practices before the competition for youth to become familiar with possible questions and how a quiz bowl works. Competition in the 4-H Dairy Bowl encourages a 4-H member to develop a more complete knowledge of dairy animals and related subjects. The contest provides an educational dairy program for 4-H members, including those who may not own or show a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop communication skills and self-confidence.

The winning dairy bowl team will represent Wisconsin at the Invitational 4-H Youth Dairy Bowl Contest at the North American International Livestock Exposition (N.A.I.L.E) in Louisville, KY.
