#### 4-H Record Books

It's time to complete your 4-H Record Book! Record Books are a way to document what you did in 4-H over the year. Your 4-H accomplishments are all in one place when you complete applications for jobs, scholarships, college, and other important experiences during your life. All members of the Barron County 4-H program (except K-2 grade members) are required to complete a Record Book to achieve in the current 4-H year. In addition you qualify for several end-of- year awards by completing a record book.

Be sure to check with your club leader for your record book information/deadlines.

#### **CLOVERBUD ACTIVITY BOOKS**

#### **Cloverbud Activity Book**

For all Cloverbuds (4-H members in grades K-2 during the 2020-2021 4-H year), Cloverbud Activity Books are available through your 4-H club leader, at the Extension Office, or online at http://barron.extension.wisc.edu (under 4-H, forms). The activity book is a fund way for cloverbuds to reflect on their experiences this past year in 4-H. Cloverbuds are encouraged to complete a book to earn a 4-H ribbon. Check with your club leader to obtain a book and to find out the due date.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT**

#### What is Achievement?

Each 4-H member gains different skills and knowledge from their personal 4-H experiences, and achieve their goals in different ways. The county achievement policy helps youth attain their 4-H goals while setting a minimum standard for activite 4-H participation.

In order to achieve in any Barron County 4-H Year, youth members must:

- \* Do a demonstration speech
- \* Exhibit a project item at the county fair (or other community event approved by the club leader)
- \* Submit a Record Book (member yearly plan and record)

All 4-H members are encouraged to Achieve during the 4-H year. Achievement makes youth eligible for the following:

- \* Event funding through the 4-H Association
- \* Livestock Sale Participation (as outlined in the Livestock Project Handbook)
- \* Eligibility for state/national opportunities.

#### 4-H EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

## **4-H Expense Reimbursement - Members & volunteers**

All 4-H members are eligible to apply for Event Funding reimbursement from the 4-H Association, up to \$150 total for the 4-H year. The reimburesement is to encourage members to take advantage of leadership and project activities and events outside of the county. These eligible events include summer camp, showing at state fair, 4-H conferences or trips, Area Animal Science Days, arts camp, etc. County fair expenses, project expenses and costs to transport your animals to events in the county are exampleas of events that would NOT be eligible. If you have a question whether something would be elieible for the Event Funding reimbursement, contact your 4-H counsil representative.

Receipts are necessary for reimburesement. Accetable expenses include registration or entry fees, gas cost, hotel if over night.

In order to request reimbursement, 4-H members must appear at a 4-H Adult Leaders Association meeting with the Even Funding Request form and receipts. (If you cannot attend in-person, other arrangements can be made). All event funding for the 4-H year must be requested at or before the October 4-H Adult Leaders meeting.

Adult volunteers who chaperone youth to events are also eligible to request reimbursement up to \$150. Ault requests have different forms than youth.





## **4-H Club Meetings**

Almost every 4-H club holds **regular** club meetings. Even within the same club, no two club meetings are the same. Ideally, every meeting should have three parts—**recreation** (**fun**), **business**, and **learning**. Youth leadership plays a huge role in the success of a club.

Most clubs have youth officers (president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and other selected roles) who are responsible for running each meeting. Youth leaders not only gain excellent life skills, they help to keep the meeting relevant and fun for members of all ages. All youth have a responsibility to contribute to their clubs through their voice and their actions!

#### What is my role as an adult?

Adults help create a safe, positive atmosphere for all 4-H members when they empower and encourage youth. While at a meeting, it's important to be a positive role model for everyone in attendance. Caring adults play an important role in the mental health of youth, and 4-H can help connect youth with positive adults.

#### Make this a positive experience.

- 1. Actively listen to all 4-H members.
- 2. Let youth run the meeting. It's their club!
- 3. Attend as many meetings as possible.
- 4. Ask your club leader how you can help.
- 5. If you have a hobby or skill, consider offering to be a guest speaker!

#### Should I stay or should I go?

It's strongly recommended that parents/guardians attend the 4-H meeting with your child. Club meetings provide great opportunities to learn with other club members, but the learning doesn't stop there. By attending the meeting, you can reflect on the meeting together and continue the education outside the club.

## How is the meeting run?

Most 4-H clubs use **parliamentary procedure** to make club decisions. See if you can put the five steps of this procedure in order. Each step is written in **bold**. The answers are found at the bottom of the adult edition.

Re-state the Motion—The president restates the motion before the group votes.	1
<b>Discussion</b> —The motion is discussed by all members.  Members might want to bring up good or bad things about the motion, or maybe find some ways that it needs to be changed.	2.
<b>Motion</b> —A motion is a request that something can be done. Only one motion should be placed before the group at one time. A motion can be discussed and changed.	3
Vote—The group votes to decide if they will pass or deny the motion. Voting usually happens by voice. Members say "aye" if they agree, and "nay" if they disagree. Voting sometimes happens in other ways (secret ballot, show of hands).	<b>4.5.</b>

#### **General Information**

Volunteer project leaders are always needed! If there is a project you would like to become involved with, or you see a need for a particular project area in the county or in your club, give the Extension Office a call or talk to your club organizational leader. No special education/experience in that project is required, only a willingness to work with youth. To become a volunteer:

- Contact the Extension Office for opportunities
- Fill out Volunteer Form/Determine role
- Enroll in 4-H as a volunteer
- Complete background check, mandated reporter training, VIP training, and any other required trainings.

## Club Organization Leaders/Co-Organization Leaders:

Club leaders work with youth and adults to offer a positive youth development experience for young people and provide leadership to the club or group organization. They serve as the main contact for clubs and the liason between the club and the county.

#### **Activity Leader/Event Volunteer:**

Provides leadership/organization for an activity or event and/or participate as a committe member. This can be on the club level or countywide.

**Financial Support:** Plat Book, Food Stand, Raffle, Scholarship


