



Barron County Fair 2022 Quilt Contest Information

This geometric-based square is the perfect opportunity to funnel your quilting creativity into a show-stopping square that will stop Fairgoers in their tracks. The winning square will be reproduced into a barn quilt board by Perfect Image Sign of Rice Lake. The board will be hung up on one of the buildings on the Barron County Fairgrounds.

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The fabric squares become property of the Barron County Fair. The squares will be sewn into a quilt and put in the Fairest of the Fair Basket to be auctioned off at the Wisconsin Fair Association Convention representing Barron County. Blueberry Line Quilting Shop will be putting the quilt together and quilt it.

- 1. The square is to be 12 1/2" x 12 1/2", prewashed cotton only, no buttons, charms, etc.
- 2. The square edges are to be unfinished
- 3. The square must NOT have curves in the design.
- 4. No more that 6 different colors, the are to be solid fabric (NO Prints)
- 5. The square is NOT to be tied or quilted. (We will be doing that after the quilt is sewed together)
- 6. The square should NOT have a batting or backing
- 7. The square should be pieced, NOT appliqued.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK PROJECT



It's time to get our 2022 YQCA (Youth Quality Care of Animals) training underway. Our guidelines state that all beef, sheep, swine, and Miss Qexhibitors must complete a <u>Face to Face/Instructor-led</u> training to show at the Barron County Fair and be eligible for the Livestock Sale.

- If you are showing animals at the Wisconsin State Fair (beef, sheep, swine, dairy, goats, rabbit, poultry) YQCA is required, either Instructor-Led or online.

Meeting dates are Monday, March 7 or Tuesday April 5, at Barron High School, 6:30 pm.

Youth need to REGISTER for the training at PRIOR to the meeting at https://yqca.learngrow.io/ -4-H families-you will use your 4-H Online information as your log in. FFA members, you need to set up items as an independent. There will be people available to assist with registration that night as well. The cost for the instructor led training is \$3-- and is paid online. This goes to YQCA for use of the digital platform.



Saturday, March 12

Have fun learning and enhancing your cake decorating skills in preparation for the Cake Revue and County Fair. We will also be practicing ways to communicate with a judge during conference judging and answering any questions regarding the Fairbook changes.



Taught and lead by 4-H leaders and skilled cake decorators: Cathy Solum, Sierra Solum, and Abigail Solum

Cost: \$18 All supplies will be provided!

Please bring a container to take your items home in and wear a face mask. A 9 X 13 cake pan or a cookie sheet with sides would work well for your container.

You will be going home with decorated cupcakes, a small cake, and many graham crackers that you have decorated.

Families do not need to split up, if in more than one session just pick one that works best for your family. We will meet their skill level as needed.

Session 1 (limit 9) 8 am- 10 AM

will be geared towards grades 7th and up

Session 1 (limit 9) from 8 am – 10 am will be geared towards grades 7th and up We will be practicing tip work with review for beginners and exploring various decorating skills including stars, shells, leaves, borders, etc. We will be using graham crackers to practice and then applying those skills to cupcakes. You will have the opportunity to use an airbrush machine and learn to make "birch bark" frosting on small cakes. You will also get to do one creative challenge cupcake which you will decorate with supplies given in your own way. We will practice discussing your cupcake and what you learned to a "judge".

Session 2 (limit 9) 10:30 am- 12:30 pm will be geared towards grades 4-6

Session 2 (limit 9) from 10:30 am – 12:30pm will be geared towards 4th-6th grade We will be learning and doing tip work including stars, shells, leaves, grass, borders etc. We will be using graham crackers to practice and then applying those skills to cupcakes. We will be making a small watermelon slice cake using only tips focusing on good presentation and uniformity for judging. You will also get to do one creative challenge cupcake which you will decorate with supplies given in your own way. We will practice discussing your cupcake and what you learned to a "judge".

Session 3 (limit 9) 1 pm- 3 pm will be geared towards grades K-3

Session 3 (limit 9) from 1 pm – 3 pm will be geared to K-3rd grade We will be introducing tip work, how to put together a frosting bag, and learning to pipe stars and leaves. We will be using graham crackers to practice and then applying those skills to cupcakes along with using candy and non-tip techniques. We will be making a small watermelon slice cake without using tips. You will also do one creative challenge cupcake which you will decorate with supplies given in your own creative way and practice telling the "judge" about it.



Judges provide feedback and placings and most categories count as fair entries, meaning you earn fair ribbons and fair premiums. When is it?

The 4-H Performance Arts Festival will be held Saturday, April 30 at Turtle Lake School beginning at 9AM.

What can you do?

Individual music, speaking, reading and demonstration can be performed and judged as a fair entry. See your county fair book for requirements. If you are entering any of these areas, you will need to put them on your fair entry registration form in order to receive your premium. **On-Stage Drama, Mini-Drama and Group Musical** Performance are all ways for your 4-H club to have a great time learning and performing together! If you need ideas for performances, contact your Extension Office where play books are available to borrow. An internet search will also reveal plays and skits for download and use. These group performances are not fair entry categories, but are for fun, entertainment, and building your skills!

Read the entry forms for specific information about length of performances and other things you need to know. For all individual and club performance, judges will talk with performers and help reflect upon what went well and possible improvements. Music * Speaking * Demonstrations * Drama Saturday, April 30 Turtle Lake School

As a reminder, many events are eligible for fair premiums Youth may <u>receive fair premium</u> for Demonstration (J-18), Musical Performance (J-18), and (Speaking (J-31) on their fair entry form for either Barron or Polk Counties. An exhibit related to this performance may be displayed at the fair.

Speaking/Interpretive Reading Entry

Open to youth grades 3 and up, except 4-H Pledge (K-4) and FFA Creed (6-9) <u>Original Speech</u> - Open to all youth. Talks should be developed by the member who is presenting it. No posters or props may be used. The youth may speak about any topic of interest. TIMES: Grades 3-4: 1-2 minutes; Grades 5-6: 2-3 minutes; Grades 7-8: 3-4 minutes; Grades 9-13: 4-6 minutes.

<u>4-H Pledge</u> - For youth Cloverbud up to Grade 4. Cloverbuds will not receive a fair premium. Pledge must be memorized. Youth will be judged on voice, stage presence, expression, general effect, and correctness.

<u>FFA Creed</u> – For youth in Grades 6-9. Creed must be memorized. Youth will be judged on voice, stage presence, expression, general effect, and correctness.

Interpretive Reading - Open to all youth, individual or team. Selections may be prose or poetry, original or selected reading. If not an original, the author must be credited. Include a short introduction to your reading. Reading should NOT be memorized. Use full-sized copies of selections (not note cards). No podium will be provided. TIMES (Individual or Team): Grades 3-4: 1-2 minutes; Grades 5-6: 2-3 minutes; Grades 7-8: 3-4 minutes; Grades 9-13: 4-6 minutes.

Demonstration Entry

Open to youth grades 3 and up, Individual or Team, one 8-foot table is provided. <u>Formal Demonstration</u> – Showing and telling an audience how to make or do something. Presents information through actions with an explanation. Has an introduction, body and conclusion followed by a time to answer questions. Select a topic of interest to you. Props and visual aids are encouraged TIMES: Grades 3-5: 4-7 minute demonstration; Grades 6-8: 5-8 minute demonstration; Grades 9-13: 8-10 minute demonstration.

<u>Action Demonstration</u> – Sharing ideas or showing how to do a skill in an informal way. The audience may participate and ask questions throughout the demonstration. The demonstrator(s) converses with audience members who are standing around the table/area. The audience participates by talking with the demonstrator, trying things, doing, tasting, asking questions, etc. Handouts, posters, pictures can be used.Select a topic of interest to you. Youth must interact and have enough supplies for the audience to take part in the demonstration. TIMES: Action demonstrations for all age groups should be up to 15 minutes.



Musical Performance Entry -Vocal, Dance, Instrumental

open to youth grades 3-13, solo or groups of 4 or less) 4-H members may enter in more than one category. Each participant should bring a copy of their music for the judge. A piano is <u>not</u> available in the instrumental room.

Vocal- Performances should emphasize vocal qualities and delivery. **TIMES:** No longer than 5 minutes.

Dance-Performances should be original and show interpretation of the musical selection.

<u>Instrumental</u>-Includes all instruments other than Piano. Please note: *a piano is NOT available in the instrumental room for accompaniment.*

<u>*Piano*</u>-Performance should show proper interpretation of the musical selection through the use of dynamics, expression, and precision.

Group Musical Performance

Performances may include vocals, instrumentals, and/or dance. Pantomiming or lip synching to recordings is not permitted.

- Performances must include five or more performers.
- All props will be the responsibility of the performers/directors.
- All performers and directors must be currently enrolled Barron or Polk County 4-H members/volunteers.
- No hay bales, straw bales, candles, real fires, liquids, or weapons of any kind (real or fake) will be used in performances.
- Performances should be no longer than 15 minutes in length, including set-up and take-down.
- Accompanists or directors will not be allowed to sing along with their group's presentation.
- Groups should give a brief introduction to the musical performance to set the stage.

Drama Entry

- All props will be the responsibility of the performers/directors.
- All actors and directors must be currently enrolled Barron or Polk County 4-H members/volunteers.
- No hay bales, straw bales, candles, real fires, liquids, or weapons of any kind (real or fake) will be used in performances.
- Performances must include two or more actors.

<u>On Stage Drama</u>—Performance length can be up to 30 minutes, including set-up and take-down time.

<u>*Mini-Drama or Skit*</u> Mini-dramas and skits can be performed at or in any place (setting) without a stage and might include puppetry, creative dramatics, etc. Mini-dramas may use props and costumes. Skits use minimal or no props and costumes. Performance length can be up to 15 minutes, including set-up and take-down time.

What's That?

A "revue" is a presentation where youth are judged on the appearance of their entries. These are pre-fair events and are judged by a certified fair judge for premium. Each revue has different entry opportunities and happen at different times before the fair. Barron County will offer the following in 2021:

- Cake Revue July 17, 2022
- Foods Revue April 24, 2022
- Clothing Revue April 24, 2022

Sunday, July 17 The Cake Revue is a pre-fair event where youth are judged on the quality of the decorating. Youth spend the year learning and practicing cake decorating. There are many ways youth can learn about cake decorating including: on their own, through videos, with someone they know, through 4-H cake decorating literature, and from countywide project days. The annual cake revue is also a great way to learn more about decorating with a critique from the judge! *Open to Cloverbuds and Youth grades 3 and up.*





The Foods Revue is a pre-fair event where youth are judged on the quality of display. Youth can create an action exhibit showcasing one activity or experiment from their project learning. Youth can also display a complete place setting of a nutritious meal or snack.



Place settings include one prepared food and a menu. Themes are encouraged. Open to Cloverbuds and Youth grades 3 and up enrolled in Foods project. Clothing Revue Sunday, April 24/at 2PM

The clothing revue is a way for youth to get a critique on the look of their sewn outfit. Entries are judged on suitability of garment to individual, general appearance, neatness, posture, and fit, poise of model, and construction to the extent that it affects general appearance. Open to youth enrolled in the clothing project in grades 3 and up.






