



BARRON COUNTY 4-H SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Barron County 4-H Scholarship, you must:

1. Be a member of 4-H for at least three years, currently enrolled and achieved in 4-H the previous year.
2. Be graduating from 4-H in the current year (4-H youth are eligible to graduate 4-H either during 12th grade or their first year in post-secondary education.)
3. Be attending or planning to attend a 4-year college, 2-year technical college or other accredited post-secondary training program.

Application Materials

A completed application consists of:

1. Two letters of recommendation from people not related to you. At least one must be from a 4-H volunteer.
2. 4-H Scholarship Application Form.
3. 4-H Essay.

Due Date

All applications materials must be returned to the 4-H Program Educator at the Barron County UW-Extension office by **June 1 of the current year**.

Scholarship Scorecard

Scholarship applications will be reviewed based on the following:

- 4-H Membership and Club Experience
- 4-H Projects
- 4-H Activities
- 4-H Leadership
- 4-H County/Community Involvement
- Letters of Recommendation
- 4-H Essay

Scholarship Distribution

Scholarship recipients will be notified by mail and honored at the 4-H graduation in July.

A minimum of 2-\$500 scholarships will be awarded each year.

Scholarship recipients must provide a copy of their first grading period grades and next semester course schedule to the 4-H Association. This information should be sent to the UW-Extension office. Also to receive any scholarship funds you must complete and achieve your final year of 4-H. All scholarship funds must be claimed within one (1) year of date of award. Any extenuating circumstances will be reviewed individually by the Barron County 4-H Association Council.

4-H Membership/Club Experience: Club participation, involvement in county programs.

Oak Grove 4-H Club — 7 years

- Participated in monthly meetings, project workshops, and community events.
- Assisted with club fundraising and helped organize annual community service projects.
- Represented the club at countywide events, including Project Discovery Day and the County Fair.

County 4-H Programs

- Active participant in County Youth Leadership Program (3 years), helping plan youth events and supporting younger members.
- Served on the County Awards Committee (1 year), reviewing applications and helping prepare recognition materials.

Club Community Service Projects — 6 years

- Participated in roadside cleanups, food drives, and holiday card-making.
- Developed teamwork and community awareness.
